A Resolution to Oppose the Nomination of Betsy DeVos as Secretary of the U.S. <u>Department of Education</u>

Mikayla Bodey (for herself, Samer Abusway, Tony Buss, Sophie Chang, Nick Prayner, Melissa Chime, and Yousef Yacoub) introduced the following resolution to the floor of the General Assembly.

Whereas the Undergraduate Student Government represents all undergraduate students at The Ohio State University, and

Whereas President Donald J. Trump has nominated Betsy DeVos for Secretary of Education to be confirmed by the United States (U.S.) Senate next week, and

Whereas DeVos has no experience as an educator in any academic institution, 1 and

Whereas DeVos supports allowing firearms in institutions of learning, a position that Undergraduate Student Government has long opposed,² and

Whereas during her confirmation hearing on January 17, 2017, DeVos declined to agree to uphold the 2011 Title IX guidance for universities when addressing cases of sexual assault, calling to question her dedication to investigating cases of campus sexual assault and the work of the It's On Us campaign,³ and

Whereas DeVos indicated in her confirmation hearing that she has no intention of working with Senate Democrats to make public higher education free or more accessible for low-income students, 4,5 and

Whereas when DeVos was asked what she would do to address college affordability, she simply offered that students should select more affordable forms of postsecondary education, including career colleges, trade and vocational schools, and community colleges, ⁶ and

Whereas DeVos displayed limited understanding of student loan debt levels, casting doubt on

38 39 Whereas experts, including Dr. Michelle Asha Cooper, president of the Institute for Higher Education Policy of Washington, D.C., question DeVos' dedication to diversity in higher 40 education, citing her past conflicting political donations.⁸ and 41 42 Whereas Lauren Asher, president of The Institute for College Access and Success, suggests that 43 DeVos has not offered or made known her position on key issues in higher education of access, 44 debt, affordability, and accountability, and 45 46 47 Whereas during her confirmation hearing, DeVos stated that she believed individual states had the right to decide whether to enforce The Individual Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and had 48 no working knowledge of the act to base that opinion, ¹⁰ and 49 50 Whereas the National Education Association, 11 Students For Education Reform, 12 and the 51 United States Student Association¹³ have voiced opposition to DeVos' nomination, and 52 53 54 Whereas it is unclear how DeVos' numerous corporate conflicts will impede her ability to make decisions in the best interest of public institutions of higher education, ¹⁴ and 55 56 Whereas DeVos has done little to clarify her positions on affordability in higher education, and 57 58 Whereas DeVos has not presented significant plans to address college affordability that align 59 with the Undergraduate Student Government's policy platform for college affordability; and 60 61 Therefore Let it Be Resolved that the Undergraduate Student Government (USG) at The Ohio 62 State University rejects the appointment of Betsy DeVos to lead the U.S. Department of 63 64 Education, and 65 Let it Further Be Resolved that USG encourages U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown and U.S. Senator 66 Rob Portman to vote no on DeVos' confirmation. 67 68 69 70 Floor Vote: Aye-23 Nay-2 Abstain-7
