9 10	Whereas the Undergraduate Student Government represents all undergraduate students, and				
11 12 13	Whereas currently the Undergraduate Student Government Constitution states that issue directors shall hold seats in the Undergraduate Student Government General Assembly, and				
14 15	Whereas this rules allows for nine members of the General Assembly to be appointed by the President rather than voted for by the student body, and				
16 17	Whereas issue directors do not have a specific student constituency, but rather are there to represent the expertise and ideas of their committee, and				
18 19 20	Whereas the expertise of the issue directors is valuable to the members of the Undergraduate Student Government, however can be represented through speaking rights without voting rights;				
21 22	Therefore let it be resolved that the Undergraduate Student Government supports measures to eliminate the 18-hour credit cap for undergraduate students; and				
23 24	Let it further be resolved that the Undergraduate Student Government Constitution shall be amended as follows, pending the approval of the student body:

Membership on the General Assembly Senators within the General Assembly shall be elected annually by undergraduate students in their respective constituencies, and shall retain full voting and speaking rights. Cabinet Directors within the General Assembly shall be appointed annually by the President, and shall serve as ex-officio members with full speaking rights but not voting rights. 				
33	i. Cabinet Directors and the senators serving on their committees shall meet at least once per month to discuss legislation and				
34	initiatives relevant to their committees.

1 46-R-38 2 A Resolution to Affirm the Right of Students to Lawfully and Peacefully Protest 3 4 Timothy Beavers and Erik Leiden (for Mohamad Mohamad) introduced the following 5 resolution, which was referred to the Steering Committee. 6 * * * 7 8 9 Whereas the Undergraduate Student Government represents all undergraduate students 10 at The Ohio State University; and 11 12 Whereas the right to freedom of expression is a protected right laid out in the 13 Constitution of the United States of America: and 14 15 Whereas lawful, peaceful protests pose no threat or harm to students, administration, 16 faculty, or property of the Ohio State University; and 17 18 Whereas student activism should be an encouraged activity for students; and 19 20 Whereas promoting a fear in students of speaking out about issues can only lead to a 21 lower level of civic engagement and efficacy; 22 23 Let it be resolved that the Undergraduate Student Government opposes the arrest of 24 students for conducting lawful, peaceful protests or other peaceful forms of student 25 activism: and 26 27 Let it further be resolved that while the Undergraduate Student Government supports 28 the right of students to lawfully and peacefully protest, this does not replace the 29 requirement of a resolution to be passed in order for the Undergraduate Student 30 Government to endorse a viewpoint; and 31 32 Let it further be resolved that the Undergraduate Student Government looks to 33 collaborate with the Columbus Police Department, the Ohio State University Police 34 Department, and other law enforcement officials to form a transparent framework for 35 conducting lawful, peaceful protests, including but not limited to: a. Obligations by Law Enforcement Officials to respect students' rights to 36 37 lawfully and peacefully protest, 38 b.
